

Dear Representative Lee:

I have the honor to refer to the Air Transport Agreement between the American Institute in Taiwan (AIT) and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the United States (TECRO) signed at Washington, D.C., March 18, 1998, (the "Agreement").

In light of recent discussions between AIT and TECRO's designated representative, Taiwan's Civil Aeronautics Administration, concerning removal from the Agreement of provisions relating to regulation of computer reservation systems, AIT proposes that Annex III to the Agreement be deleted. If the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the United States (TECRO) concurs with this proposal, AIT further proposes that this letter and an affirmative letter in reply from TECRO shall constitute an agreement on this subject which shall enter into force on the date of the letter in reply from TECRO.

I shall be grateful to have your reply on this subject.
