

Minutes of Meeting
AIT and CCNAA
Consultations on Strategic Trade Controls
June 18-20, 1991

In order to promote their interest in security, effective maintenance of economic development and protection of the rights and interests of legitimate enterprises, CCNAA and AIT agree to a due course of action, in stages, on the implementation of the MOU.

Both CCNAA and AIT are satisfied with the efforts undertaken thus far on the MOU. CCNAA and AIT agree to the need to base a system on law. AIT also understands the complexity of establishing a STC system and AIT will provide necessary technical assistance to CCNAA in the establishment of this system in stages. CCNAA representatives and AIT representatives have agreed to the following work programs to move forward implementation of the agreed protection of strategic exports.

- * Export Enforcement Training - Taipei
- * Licensing Administration and Enforcement Training - Washington, D.C.
- * Technical Support for COCOM Core List - Washington, D.C.
- * Public Awareness Seminar - Taipei

The exact dates and contents of the above mentioned programs, which should be completed in the course of the next year, will be decided during the next STC consultation on July 30, 1991. Based on the spirit of cooperation, both sides will review the progress of MOU next June. CCNAA sincerely welcomes the AIT delegation to visit Taipei on July 30, for further STC consultations.
