Mission

Launched in 2013, NYO-USA —the first of its kind in US history —unites the finest young musicians aged 16–19 in the United States for a full-scholarship, two-week residency with leading orchestral musician coaches, followed by an international tour with a world-class conductor and soloist. NYO-USA shines a light on the incredible talent of young American instrumentalists, allowing them to share their gift on an international stage while offering each participant a transformative musical and cultural experience; fosters the leadership skills of these talented teen musicians, inspiring them to achieve at the highest level; seeks to ensure that they share their learning with other young musicians in the US and overseas; and showcases these young musicians as cultural ambassadors for the United States; with select concerts disseminated to audiences worldwide through webcasts, television, and radio broadcasts.

Through interacting with audiences, fellow young musicians, and the public at large, the bright young musicians of NYO-USA promote mutual understanding across cultures. When they are not engaging communities abroad, NYO-USA musicians are equally committed to connecting with communities locally through a wide variety of community engagement activities and as mentors for young aspiring musicians.

NYO-USA Around the World: Previous Tours

Summer 2013: The inaugural tour made triumphant debuts in Purchase, New York; Washington, DC; **Moscow; St. Petersburg;** and **London**, in sold-out concerts led by Valery Gergiev and featuring soloist Joshua Bell. BBC Proms Festival broadcasted the final performance on radio and TV.

Summer 2014: NYO-USA made its Carnegie Hall debut and embarked on a **coast-to-coast US tour** from Tanglewood to Walt Disney Concert Hall with David Robertson and violinist Gil Shaham.

Summer 2015: NYO-USA continued to break new ground with its first tour to Asia, performing in **seven cities across China** with conductor Charles Dutoit and pianist YUNDI.

Summer 2016: NYO-USA toured Continental **Europe**, and performed two full programs under two renowned conductors –Christoph Eschenbach and Valery Gergiev –with two extraordinary soloists –Emanuel Ax and Denis Matsuev.

Summer 2017: NYO-USA made its Latin America debut, touring Guadalajara, Mexico; Quito, Ecuador; and Bogotá, Colombia with conductor Marin Alsop.

NYO-USA's Return to Asia: July – August 2018

Carnegie Hall believes that Asia, with its profound passion for classical music, incredible rising talent, and young audiences, will play a central role in a coming golden age for music. We deeply value our longstanding and expanding relationship with Asia through cultural exchanges such as presenting great music and performers, sharing educational opportunities, providing professional development, and fostering international understanding.
