



FULBRIGHT SPECIALIST PROGRAM

BRING THE EXPERTISE OF A U.S. SCHOLAR OR PROFESSIONAL TO YOUR INSTITUTION

The Fulbright Specialist Program is a unique opportunity for U.S. Academics and established professionals to engage in two- to six-week, project-based exchanges at host institution across the globe. The host institution provides the lodging, meals and any in-country program-related travel. The U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA) pays for the grantee's international travel and a stipend.

Institutions eligible to request a Fulbright Specialist include, but are not limited to:

Institutions of Higher Education • Government Institutions (ministries or agencies, courts, parliamentary or congressional bodies) • Cultural Institutions (conservatories, museums, etc.) • Non-Governmental Organizations including non-partisan, issue-centered institutions and think tanks • Medical Institutions (public health organizations, teaching hospitals, etc.)

Eligible Disciplines

Agriculture • American (U.S.) Studies (art, art history, dance, history, literature, music, popular culture, religion, theater and women's studies)

- Anthropology • Archaeology • Biology Education • Business Administration • Chemistry Education • Communications and Journalism
- Computer Science and Information Technology • Economics • Education • Engineering Education • Environmental Science • Law
- Library Science • Math Education • Peace and Conflict Resolution Studies • Physics Education • Political Science • Public Administration
- Public/Global Health • Social Work • Sociology • Urban Planning

(AIT is especially interested in projects related to the following priority areas: Business Administration and Job Creation, Cyber Security and IT, Media Literacy/Countering Disinformation, Public Administration, Natural Disaster Response, and STEM.)

Possible Project Activities

- Delivering a seminar or workshop • Consulting on faculty or workforce development • Developing academic or training curricula and materials
- Lecturing at the graduate or undergraduate level • Conducting needs assessments or evaluations for a program or institution

Timing

Once a project has been submitted to ECA, a minimum of two months is needed to process a request for a scholar or professional already on the roster. A minimum of three months is needed for a scholar or professional not on the roster at the time of the request.

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
